

# DO YOU KNOW THAT?

A. Some nouns may have two plural forms:

buffalo – buffalos/buffaloes

mosquito – mosquitos/mosquitoes

tornado – tornados/tornadoes.

B. In a compound noun plural with prepositions or adverbs, we added "s" to the first noun generally.

mother-in-law – mothers-in-law passer-by – passers-by runner-up – runners-up.

But in:

errand-boy – errand-boys godfather – godfathers maidservant – maidservants stepdaughter – stepdaughters. C. In an open form compound noun, the standard pluralizing rule is to add an "s" to the main noun.

For example:

"half brothers" or "sergeants major" or "post offices."

D. The "s" can also be added at the end such as in the case of "six-packs" of soda.

E. In compound nouns that include the words man and woman, the two words go into plural: woman doctor – women doctors manservant – menservants.

Exception: "Police"

policeman – policemen/policewoman – policewomen.
