

# Who built the pyrami

According to History the pyramids were built by the Egyptians who lived in villages and not by slaves or foreigners. Some of these workers were permanent employees of the pharaoh. Other employees were ones who have been picked for a limited time from local villages. Others may have been women. Although no depictions of women workers have been found. Such conclusions were made because some female skeletons show wear that suggests they worked with heavy stone for long periods of time.

# Why did pyramids exist?

Ancient Egyptians believed that when the pharaoh died, he became Osiris, king of the dead. The new pharaoh became Horus, god



of the heavens and protector of the sun god. This cycle was symbolized by the rising and the setting of the sun.

Some part of a dead pharaoh's spirit, called his Ka, was believed to remain with his body. And it was thought that if the corpse did not have proper care, the former pharaoh would not be able to carry out his new duties as king of the dead. If this happened, the cycle would be broken and disaster would befall Egypt.


# What was the most remarkable event in History?



### THE FIRST MAN TO STEP ON THE MOON.

In 1969, Neil Armstrong was the first man to walk on the moon. The astronaut stepped onto the moon's surface about 20 minutes after first opening the hatch on the Eagle landing craft. As he put his left foot on the moon's surface he declared: "That's one small step for man, one giant leap for mankind." He described the surface as being like powdered charcoal and the landing craft left a crater about a foot deep.


Neil Armstrong was accompanied by two other astronauts: Edwin Aldrin and Collins. Armstrong and Aldrin spent 21 hours on the Moon and part of this time was spent outside the landing module. Both astronauts rejoined the mothership and the colleague Collins and returned to Earth on July 24th.

The three men spent 21 days at an American military base in quarantine.

The Moon landing marked the pinnacle of the space race and American investment in the space program failed.

After such a race 10 other astronauts travelled to the Moon in six missions. The final manned lunar landing was completed in December 1972 by Apollo 17.


